The school website is our main form of communication during an emergency and it will be updated as regularly as possible.

Maths - How can I support my child?	
 The best way to support your child's understanding of maths is as follows: Talk about / read numbers eg: letterboxes, number plates, prices, percentages, sales, car speeds, shapes, maths vocab etc Practical maths opportunities: shopping, measurement (cooking, building, etc), card games, flash cards etc Help children to learn basic facts. This includes groups to 5 (4+1, 3+2 etc), groups to 10 (9+1, 4+6 etc), times tables and division. We meet together with Maths Lead Teachers from all town's schools each term. The feedback from both of the High Schools is that the most important thing to do to help children with maths is to teach them to read! So much of the assessment of children's understanding in maths is problem solving, so if the children can not read the question then they are not able to apply their maths knowledge!
